The CCC welcomes guest Judith D'Amico on Sunday, June 26th when she will speak at each of the Sunday services. Do give her a warm welcome. She will update us all on the ongoing work in Haiti. Her bio follows:

Philadelphia native and physician, Dr. Judith D'Amico, went to Haiti in 1986 as a missionary. Since that time she has lived and worked in Haïti for seventeen of the last 24 years. After her missionary service ended, she worked for a number of non-profit organizations including directorship of Hôpital Albert Schweitzer, World V ision Haïti, Plan International Haïti and Global Fund Haïti. After the earthquake in 2010, Dr. D'Amico founded Rebati Kay-la, to help Haitian families rebuild their homes. Later that year the Conejo Compassion Coalition joined forces with Rebati kay-la to help bring this project to fruition. Shortly thereafter an indigenous community organization was formed consisting of skilled trades people who were committed to the goals of Rebati Kay-la. These three organizations worked together to rebuild homes and restore lives of poor and neglected families in Haiti, and that work continues to the present time.
