A Message From Your Priest

All Saints' Day (not Christmas!) is the second greatest feast day in the Church's liturgical year; only Easter Day is ranked as a more important celebration. In fact, unlike any other great feast, the celebration of All Saints' Day may be transferred to the Sunday following the actual date of the feast (which is November 1).

The two feasts of Easter and All Saints' remind us of the two great truths of our faith: the Resurrection of Christ that makes our spiritual journey into eternal life possible, and the triumph of all the saints, who live out the victory of the Risen Christ in the glory of heaven. On All Saints' Day, the emphasis is on all the saints - known and unknown, the famous and the unsung, the renowned and "those whose faith is known to God alone." We remember our own saints, those with whom we lived and loved and who have died, in the reading of the Necrology at the center of this Liturgy. Does that make All Saints' a sad day? Yes, in the sense that our grief and loss, even our tears, have a home in the Liturgy and in the Church. But All Saints' is ultimately a great feast of the triumph of the Risen Christ. It's the Easter mystery at its ultimate glory. It's a reminder of the day to come when "Christ will be all in all." Therefore, let us keep the Feast!

See y'all this Sunday at 9:00 am...and don't forget to turn your clocks back an hour before you go to bed Saturday night!
