### A Message from Your Rector

Dear Friends,

Pentecost is almost here, and you know what that means!  
Happy Birthday, Church!

On Sunday we will memorialize the coming of God's Holy Spirit to live within us and to guide us, and the sacred event of God calling the church into being. But, there is so much more going on in the story of that first Pentecost...

The church's birth day corresponded with an ancient Jewish holy day celebrated fifty days after the first Sabbath in the Feast of Unleavened Bread. This festival has its roots in the Exodus story when God instructed the Hebrews to make bread without leavening so to be ready at any moment to be delivered from slavery in Egypt. Jesus taught in the synagogues during the feast and made stern warnings against being tainted by the yeast of the religious leaders whose teachings were burdensome to the people of God.

For the first Jesus followers at Pentecost, and for us today, Jesus calls us to live lives of authenticity and sincerity. His Good News is that God created us to be the fullest expression of ourselves possible – the you and me God created from the beginning – and to do that Jesus gave us his Way. He also gave his very life for ours so that we might live our lives to the fullest in the Kingdom of God. As Paul wrote to the church in Corinth, "For Christ our Passover also has been sacrificed. Therefore let us celebrate the feast, not with old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth." This Sunday is a day to celebrate God's generosity and love for every creature, great and small, for we all benefit from the transforming power of the Holy Spirit living and re-creating among and within us.

Be sure to be here...and wear red! Come, celebrate the gifts of God! Come, let us celebrate life!
